## THE FIJIAN GOVERNMENT NATIONAL TOPPERS SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME (NTS) FOR LOCAL STUDIES FOR 2021

There are 600 Fijian Government National Toppers Scholarships to undertake full time undergraduate studies from term one of 2021 in one of the priority areas. These are full scholarships funded by the Fijian Government in line with its vision of “Building a Smarter Fiji”.

It is important to note that any program not included in the national priorities areas list does not qualify for the NTS Scholarships for 2021.

Also when applying, if a program is not listed in the online application drop down menu or the same is not listed under an institution, it means that the program or the program offered by the institution does not qualify for NTS Local Scholarship.

#### **Eligible Higher Education Institutions for NTS Local Scholarships:**

- Fiji National University.
- The University of the South Pacific.
- University of Fiji.
- Corpus Christi Teachers College.
- Fulton Adventist University College.
- Sangam Institute of Technology

#### **Application Eligibility Criteria**

Applicants must satisfy all of the following criteria to be eligible to apply for NTS local scholarship:

- i. Must be a Fijian Citizen;
- ii. Must be an ordinarily resident in Fiji for at least three years prior to the award commencement date;
- iii. Must be either in Year 13 or such Equivalent Studies as determined by the Board in 2020 and is applying for the scholarship for commencement of studies from academic term 1 of the new academic calendar (2021);
- iv. Foundation Studies and Students who repeat Year 13 are not eligible to apply for NTS;
- v. Must be applying for one of the Fijian Government priority areas as per the list provided in this communication; and

- vi. Must secure a place at a Higher Education Institution by means of a final offer letter before the application processing closing date.

### **Other General Application Rules**

- i. Applicants must apply for NTS Scheme and list three choices **in the order of priority** from the most preferred to the least preferred choice.
- ii. Applicants must list their 3 choices carefully as priority will be given to the first stated choice. Second and third listed choices will only be considered if there are scholarships available in the category after all first choices have been processed.
- iii. All NTS Local Scholarship applicants are required to fill in 3 program choices under the Tertiary Education Loans Scheme (“TELS”). In case the NTS application is not successful, the application will then be moved to TELS and processed accordingly. As such there is no need for an NTS applicant to apply for TELS separately.

### **Required Documents for Application**

1. A completed online application form. Visit [www.tslb.com.fj](http://www.tslb.com.fj) to access the online application portal.
2. An official academic transcript for Year 12 and 13 or equivalent Studies (*Students can apply without Year 13/Foundation Studies before the application closing date but need to submit the same as soon as the results are released, however no later than the application processing closing date*).
3. Offer letter from the Higher Education Institute. (*Students can apply without the final offer letter from the Higher Education Institutions, but need to submit the same as soon as the offer letters are received, however no later than the application processing closing date*).
4. Certified true copy of the Birth Certificate.
5. Copy of Student’s TIN Letter/FRCA-FNPF Joint Card.
6. Evidence of Parents’/Guardians’ Income (Salary Slip for working parents/guardians or Statutory Declaration prepared and signed by the parents/guardians and witnessed by a Justice of Peace (JP) or Commissioner of Oaths for parents/guardians who are not working or are in self-employment. Parents /Guardians running a business must submit the most recent tax assessment by FRCS).
7. Copy of Parents’/Guardians’ TIN Letter/FRCA-FNPF Joint Card.
8. Copy of bank statement with account under the applicant’s name.
9. Recent passport size photo.

### **Application Process**

1. Scan and get all the required documents ready before starting the process of applying online in the pdf, png, or jpg format.
2. Visit [www.tslb.com.fj](http://www.tslb.com.fj) and register for TSLB online application. Applicants cannot apply online unless registered first.
3. Once registered fill in the appropriate information.
4. Upload all the required documents.
5. Submit the online application.
6. Students will not be able to submit the form unless all mandatory fields are filled (With the exception of Year 13 results and final program offer letter from the institutions).

### **Application Assessment and Selection Criteria**

1. The following assessment and selection criteria will apply:
  - i. Provisional Year 13 Results from Ministry of Education, Heritage and Arts will be obtained by TSLB after the release of the results.
  - ii. Results for all other examinations deemed equivalent of Year 13 as determined by the Board will also be obtained from the applicants;
  - iii. All results will be converted to a common denomination (percentage of the total aggregate score) for ease of comparison.
  - iv. Aggregate scores for each student will be calculated based on the Minimum Entry Requirement as per Schedule 1.
  - v. After converting all results to a common unit of measurement, the applicants would be ranked in a descending order (highest to lowest) for each category and sub-category of awards. This will form part of the national ranking of all applicants based on academic merit.
  - vi. Only complete applications will be ranked. All incomplete applications will miss out on the ranking.
  - vii. After the national ranking, ranking of applicants for each priority category and sub-category will be done in a descending order. For example, if the Category Infrastructure has 90 awards, the top 90 applicants for this category will be identified and ranked in the descending order. In a similar way, ranking for each category will be completed.
  - viii. Preference by TSLB for ranking by category will be given to the first indicated choice of the applicants in the application form.
  - ix. Only if the quota for a category or sub-category is not filled based on the first indicated choice of the applicants, second choice would be considered. Third choice will only be considered if the quota for a category or sub-category is not filled after all first and second choices have been considered and exhausted in the ranking process;
  - x. After the ranking for the shortlisted applicants for each category is completed, all other applications for the scheme for an academic calendar would be moved to TELS and processed as per the eligibility criteria.
- (2) Shortlisted and ranked students may be required to attend an interview if deemed necessary before the final decision is made.
- (3) In case interviews are conducted by TSLB, the final ranking and decision will be based on the total weighted scores of the applicants for each category.
- (4) All shortlisted applicants for each category would be ranked in the descending order and the top ranked students would be made an offer until the predetermined quota as per Schedule 1 is filled.
- (5) The final decision on the awards will be made by TSLB as per the prescribed criteria.
- (6) All decisions of TSLB in relation to the awarding of scholarships shall be final and shall not be subject to an appeal as stipulated under Section 13(2) of the Act.
- (7) All successful applicants must complete, sign and upload the provisional offer scholarship letter and bond agreement within 7 days from the date stated on the offer letter. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of the offer by TSLB.
- (8) Scholarships will only be confirmed after TSLB has issued the scholarship confirmation letter after assessing the completed offer letter and bond agreement.

### **Application and Processing Opening and Closing Dates**

These dates will be advertised by TSLB in the near future. Visit TSLB website [www.tslb.com.fj](http://www.tslb.com.fj) or Facebook account (Tertiary Scholarship and Loans Board) to find out about the opening and closing dates. These dates will also be advertised in the media.

The Online Application Portal is currently closed and will be accessible once the applications open.

Late and incomplete applications will STRICTLY not be considered.
