

FNU Update Monday, 14 February 2022



Dear FNU students and applicants,

Following the announcement made by the Acting Prime Minister on Sunday 6 February, and the subsequent directive received from the Fiji Higher Education Commission on Friday 11 February, I am pleased to inform everyone that the Fiji National University will fully re-open for on-campus business from Tuesday 15 February 2022.

All academic services will open, which means that new and continuing students can visit any FNU campus across Fiji and complete their admission and registration process.

For ease and quick process of admission and registration, we will have dedicated One-Stop Student Service Centres. The Centre will have experienced staff from different divisions who will be able to quickly assist students with enrolment, I-T requirements and selection of study options.

The following campuses will have these dedicated Centres to serve new and continuing students: Nasinu, Samabula, Koronivia, Ba, Lautoka, Nadi and Labasa.

FNU's 2022 Enrolment Drive is currently underway and if students require information about programme listing and studying options you can visit **www.fnu.ac.fj**

Admission and registration for all programmes are currently underway as per the current University opening timeline, Semester 1 will commence on 21 March.
